However, it makes no practical
difference. We could not ask officers to
give security in respect of spots to which
they were appointed without any

intimation that security would be required. I imagine that the Treasury would never consent to pay the premiums ^{to a Guarantee Society} out of C.A. funds. It is their settled practice to be their own insurers. So it is no good making the suggestion to them. 19

The best course appears to be to send the list which has been approved to the C.A. & ask them whether they can make an agreement with the Guardian Assurance Company to guarantee the ^{officers from time to time holding} ~~holders~~ of these appointments, explaining to the Company that (with the exception of the three officers already guaranteed) the present holders cannot be required to give security, but that whenever a vacancy occurs & a new holder is appointed, his name will be notified to the Company, & the liability of the Company in respect of such holder & the liability of the Govt

My Lord,

In confirmation of a telegram No. 173 of the 10th ultimo respecting officers required to guarantee their fidelity under the new scheme I have the honour to transmit herewith a list of the posts which it is considered desirable to secure.

2. In accordance with paragraph 1 of Your Lordship's despatch No. 21 of November 21 last the holders of these posts will not be required to pay increased premia during their tenure but their successors will have to do so. As most of the posts in question have not previously been secured at all, the list of officers now being required in the East and still require to do so under the new scheme is a very small one and in fact includes only the Assistant Engineers in the Public Works Department viz, Messrs Bush, Stedman, and Macnaghten.
