Uganda Railway - Makindu Water Supply

Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 16th October No. 36312/1905, transmitting to us a copy of correspondence with the Officer Administering the Government of the East African Protectorate on the subject of the water supply of Makindu.

2. We communicated a copy of your letter and its enclosures to the Consulting Engineers and they furnished us with a specification and drawing of a pump of the pattern asked for in the memorandum of the 6th September by the General Manager of the Uganda Railway, a copy of which accompanied your letter. We have obtained a tender and the cost of the pump will be £230 f.o.b.

3. I have to request the Secretary of State's instructions as to whether we should order the plant.
