## Explanatory Memorandum

Provision has been taken as in 1910-11 for the services of 1 Assistant Auditor in Somaliland. Up to the present it does not appear to have been decided whether any change will be necessary in the existing arrangements for the local audit of the accounts and it is contemplated that the Assistant Auditor (Mr. Biden) will resume his duties at Berbera on the expiration of his present leave. The amount of his salary is shown as recoverable from Somaliland funds.

It is contemplated that the salary of 1 Assistant Auditor will be repaid by the Zanzibar Government. (See also ).

The provision taken under these items includes the following amounts which, in addition to the salary of 1 Assistant Auditor, it is considered should be repaid by the Zanzibar Government:-

1 3rd Grade Clerk	£100
Travelling Allowance	15
Zanzibar share of Officers' passages	20
Incidental Expenses	10.

The proposed repayment of these amounts by the Zanzibar Government has been approved by the Consul General by whom they have been submitted for the sanction of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs (see 21875/10).

The amount provided for this service in 1910-11 was £485.

Prior to the amalgamation of the late Colonial Audit Branch with the Exchequer and Audit Department in 1906 the scale of salary for Assistant Auditors in East Africa was £300 by £10 to £400. By reason of the conditions which arose



arose through that amalgamation it was found convenient  
to appoint junior Assistant Auditors at a minimum of  
salary and local allowance combined of £250 and the three  
junior Assistant Auditors now serving in East Africa were so  
appointed. It has, however, been represented that, con-  
sidering the special circumstances in which Audit Officers  
are placed, and by comparison with other officers in the  
Protectorate, the minimum of £250 is inadequate. A copy of  
a letter from the Local Auditor on this subject is appended.  
Having regard to all the circumstances, I consider that  
there appears to be sufficient justification for recommend-  
ing that the former minimum salary of £300 may be reverted  
to, with effect from the 1st April 1911. The number of  
officers who would be affected by this proposed change is  
three only and the total increase, as affecting the Estimates  
for 1911-12, would be £37.

Sir,

herewith  
I have the honour to submit for your favourable consideration two applications from Messrs Faulkner and Bett for an increased Colonial Allowance. Since my arrival in this country in 1897 the cost of living has increased enormously, servants' wages have gone up 75%, Customs duties have risen from 5% ad valorem on dry goods to 10%, new taxes and rates have been imposed and the prices of meat, eggs and vegetables have doubled themselves. In addition to this, there are subscriptions to clubs and societies. The range of the audit has been extended and an Assistant stationed, say, at Nairobi has to be prepared to start at any time for Uganda, Zanzibar, Mombasa or Somaliland, in each of which places different furniture and clothes are necessary and new entrance fees to the different clubs are required. In the case of a married man these expenses are doubled. I would also ask you to consider the varied nature of their duties and the great financial responsibility attached thereto.

In the Administration an Officer's starting pay is £250 per annum. He is stationed in an out-district where living is very cheap and in the course of four or five years he rises to £400 a year. Under the circumstances I would therefore respectfully suggest that the Colonial Allowance for Assistant Auditors stationed in East Africa Protectorate be increased from £150 to £200 per annum.
