In continuation of my telegram No. 79 of the 23rd ultimo the Director of Surveys has reported that a draughtsman sent out by the Crown Agents for the Cadastral Branch of the Survey Department on a salary of £180 a year, a Mr. J. Williams, is a most suitable candidate for the post of Chief Computer and Examiner of Diagrams.

2. Mr. Williams is an Associate Member of the Institute of Civil Engineers, a good mathematician and an excellent computer and I would suggest that he should be appointed Chief Computer on a salary of £180 a year to commence with the rate to be finally determined after six months work as Chief Computer.

3. The effect of this proposal would be a saving of £180 on the sanctioned salary for the post for the current year and I therefore recommend the appointment of Mr. Williams in view of the fact that since framing his Estimates the Director of Surveys has expressed a wish for an additional

additional draughtsman in the Cadastral Branch to cope with the steadily increasing work, and in this way the additional appointment can be made and an actual saving still effected on the estimates.

4. If this additional appointment meets with Your Lordship's approval, I have to all appearances a most suitable candidate for the post in a Mr. W. T. Morris and unless Your Lordship has any actual candidate in view I should be glad if, in the event of my enquiries proving satisfactory, he might be given the first chance of refusal.

5. I would propose to appoint a Mr. Fischer at present a temporary draughtsman in the Cadastral Branch on a salary of £80 a year to replace Mr. Williams. He is well reported on by the Director of Surveys and is a suitable candidate.

6. To recapitulate, my proposals are:-

- (1) to appoint Mr. Williams, Chief Computer and Examiner on a salary of £180. His salary to be finally determined after 6 months service as Chief Computer.
- (2) to appoint an additional Draughtsman on £160 a year to be paid from the savings effected on (1) (Mr. Morris).
- (3) to appoint Mr. Fischer to replace Mr. Williams.

7. If these proposals meet with Your Lordship's approval there will be a saving on the Estimates for some years and though the eventual liability may be somewhat increased the appointments would be temporary and adjustments could be made as the agreements expire.
