With reference to my despatch No. 519 or the 27th autimo, respecting passages, I have the honour to report that, whatever decision four Lordship may give as to the routes to be employed when officers go on leave, it is highly undesirable for officers proceeding to East Africa on first appointment to travel by the Union Castle Line.

2. In the cases of Mr. Hughes and Mr. Lawson Walton half pay was drawn to the amount of £14.9.0 as against £6.17.1. had they travelled by the Canal. Each of these officers therefore cost the Protectorate £7.11.11 more than was necessary before taking up duty. Moreover the time apent on the voyage was 42 days instead of £1 days at most via Suez. We were therefore deprived of the services of these officers for £1 days longer than we need have been.
