On my predecessor's recommendation Your Lordship in your despatch Ne 330 of September 3rd 1909 sanctioned the payment of a bonus of 250 for a knowledge of Hindustant, provided that the officers eligible for this bonus be only those of the Public Works. Department or such others as ean prove to the satisfaction of the Governor that Hindastani is of real assistance to them in the execution of their duties. I found on my arrival in East Africa that a very high standard had been set for this examination, which included, besides conversation in Mindustani, translation at sight from books in the Uron character into English, and translation from English into

No candidate have consequently been examined as no one had acquired sufficient knowledge of the language; and it was suggested to me by the examiners the there should be two standards, as in Swahili, but that, unlike Swahili, a bonus of £25 should be paid to those candidates who passed the Lower Standard Examination.

I am personally adverse to the payment or bonuses for a knowledge of Hindustani and, although I do not propose that the bonus for the Higher Standard should be abolished just ret, as , fee officials have spent both time and money in preparing for 12 1 consider it quite unnece, and the Pretectorate Starr (official, in this Protocorate) to have such an intimate acquaintance with the language as is now demanded, and I therefore suggest @ that in say one year from now the offer of bonuses of £50 should be discontinued. strongly opposed to the suggested payment of 225 for a pass in the Lower Standard Examination, as I consider that when an ormicer has Indian employees serving under him, it is his duty to be sufficiently acquainted with their language to be able to converse with them, and until he is able to dispense with an interpreter ha neither fit for promotion nor should he be given an increment of pay.

- The offer of a bonus for Hindustant has already raised the question as to whether an official should not be paid a bonus for a knowledge of Cape Dutch as there are a number of Boers now resident in the Protectorate.

 Needless to say F disapprove of any such proposal.
- 4. I am fully in accord with the principle of paying a bonus to those officials who are able to pass the Higherstandard Examination in Swahili and also to those who acquire a thorough working knowledge of the leaser known East African tongues, which enables thom to act as efficient interpreters. I consider, however, that the previous instructions on these points should be somewhat altored and that the exact amount of the bonus to be paid, should be left to the discretion of the Governor provided that in no case more than 250 can be earned for any one language.
