My Lord,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Your Lordship's despatch No. 296 of the 26th of May last.

2. Your Lordship's remarks in paragraphs 2, 3 (a), (e), (f), (g), (h) have been noted.

3. With regard to 3 (c) the Agency estimates as originally submitted by the Acting Agent General amounted to £1,759 and were subsequently reduced by Your Lordship to £1,729 (Your Lordship's despatch No. 685 of the 11th of November 1909) and this latter figure appears in the Protectorate Estimates.

4. The Estimates approved for 1909-10 amounted to £1,649 i.e., £1,549 as submitted by the Agent General (Your Lordship's despatch No. 149 of the 23rd of March 1909) plus £100 increase in Mr. Simson's emoluments (Your Lordship's despatch No. 174 of the 2nd of April 1909).

5. The increase for 1910-11 is consequently £80, one half of which £40 falls on the East Africa Protectorate.

the comparative statement of estimates for 1909-10  
and 1910-11 submitted to Your Lordship by the Agent  
General. In this statement the sanctioned 1909-10  
expenditure is incorrectly shewn as £1,697 instead  
of £1,649.

2. This difference of £48 in the 1909-10 figures  
is due to certain additional expenditure sanctioned  
apparently after the estimates had been submitted:-

Appointment of the 8th Clerk @ Rs.35 p.m.	Rs.452
Increase to 3rd Clerk at Rs.60 p.m.	72
Increase to 4th Clerk at Rs.6 p.m.	72
Increase to Head Sepoy	16
Increase to 4 Sepoys	52
Increase to Hamal	18
Increase to Punkah Boys	40
= £48 approximately.	

3. No communication sanctioning the above increase  
appears to have been received here but from Mr. Simpson's  
minutes of the 21st of October 1909 in Your Lordship's  
despatch No.695 of the 11th of November 1909 it would  
appear that they took the view of the engagement of  
a clerk on Rs.80 to Rs.100 which was sanctioned in  
Colonial Office despatch to the Agent General No.4512  
of the 1st of December 1908.

4. The sanction for this increase was not  
received here till the 10th of April 1910 under  
consideration and action  
with the old estimate.

London, there is no means of checking actual payments.

10. Eight more copies of the revised Estimates are being forwarded on a separate cover in accordance with the instructions contained in paragraph 5 of your Lordship's despatch. I regret I am unable to supply the full number asked for.
