My Lord,

I have the honour to request permission to open a Suspense Account in connection with the Education Department Estimates to which the receipts and expenditure for scholars' boarding are to be charged.

Under Colonial Regulation 225 it is laid down that no receipts should be credited to Revenue. As a necessary consequence all expenditure must be estimated for, and cannot be set off against it. In consequence, the this revenue which is charged to cover the cost of feeding the children's suspense account would

The Education Board and the unofficial members of it in particular are strongly opposed to the Education Vote being swollen by the receipts which are merged in general Protectorate Revenue. They say, with some justice, that the amount spent on Education may thus be made to appear unduly large in comparison with the results obtained.
