The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have had before them Mr. Antrobus' letter of the 7th ultimo (33070/1905), with its accompanying statement showing "sums required to be spent during the year 1905-6 from the funds in hand on March 31st 1905" in the East Africa Protectorate.

2 In transmitting this statement Mr. Secretary Lyttelton observes that he understands it "to have been the practice of the Foreign Office to send a receipt of a statement of this kind, to give effect to the reference to Their Lordships, of the application for the payment of sums provided in any Bill for the year in question in the following year." It is noted that a receipt had been provided in the year 1904-5 at the close of the year.
