In continuation of my despatch No. 348 of the 18th instant, I have the honour to make a further recommendation for appointment in the Forestry Department.

2. Mr. C. A. Turpin was appointed a temporary Forester on the 12th December 1908 and as it has been decided to dispense with his services, he has been given three months' notice from the 26th September.

3. In his place I would ask your Lordship to sanction the appointment of Mr. George Ross as Forester on the usual terms with salary of £120 per annum.

On reference to my despatch No. 706 of the 11th December 1909 Your Lordship will notice that Mr. Hanson stands in the highest terms of Mr. Ross, and on this recommendation he would be most suitable for appointment; he received his forest training at the Forest of Dean School of Forestry and at the Armstrong College, Newcastle.
