at our station at Churru Moyale with instructions
from Addis Ababa to retrace the red line on Maud's
map of the frontier and to claim the station Churru
Moyale as in Abyssinian territory. I have enquired
of the Addis Ababa telegraph whether he has
any information on this point as reported above.
