Minute recommending extension of service of  
the additional Asst. Auditor to East A. to  
be available for duty in Somaliland until  
March 1911.

Mr. Read:-

Will you please see the letters to the East A. Dept. from  
the C.O. (Nos: 16940/09 and 18921/09) of the 26th May and  
16th June 1909 relating to the appointment of an additional  
Assistant Auditor in East Africa and incidentally referring  
to the local audit of expenditure accounts of Somaliland.  
In accordance with the authority which was then given an  
Assistant Auditor was appointed on the 7th July 1909 and  
his appointment will normally terminate on the 6th July  
next. In the estimates of audit cost for 1910-11, submit-  
ted to the Colonial Office by the East A. Dept. letter No: 846  
of the 18th July 1909 provision was made for the continued  
employment of this additional Assistant Auditor throughout  
that year on the assumption, as stated in the letter, that  
the services of one of the Assistant Auditors on the East  
Africa Local Audit establishment would continue to be re-  
quired in Somaliland. The Assistant Auditor (Mr. Eiden)  
who has been in Somaliland since 16th November 1908 (having
