§19.

The Government reserves the right to issue regulations respecting close seasons which may have become necessary for individual kinds of game.

It is prohibited to shoot in the close seasons.

§20.

Persons may be held accountable for detailed regulations of the Governor for killing harmful animals and also for disturbing the eggs of harmful reptiles.

§21.

Infringements of the provisions contained in this Act are punishable with imprisonment for a period not exceeding 3 months or with a fine not exceeding 400 Rupees in so far as different punishment is not laid down in the following regulations.

Imprisonment for a period not exceeding 3 months or a fine of 100 Rupees, either separately or together, except for a person who without authorization,

(1) uses a gun mentioned in Class I or Class II, or (2) starts in his gun reserve fixed by the Administration for the purpose of protecting game,

any person who does not carry his licensed gun when hunting if he does not show it to the constable who authorizes the engagement in hunting or fire not exceeding 100 Rupees to a magistrate.

In the case of firearms and other articles with the same legal proceeding as pistols, the punishment admissible in accordance with the Imperial Commissioner's decree of 1870, is to be imposed.

In addition to the punishment, the hunting cartridges, the illegal arms and the traps, instruments and other appliances used may be confiscated whether they belong to the condemned person or not.

§22.

that has crossed over onto land that is under cultivation or otherwise in use, if this object is the intent of use.

Not only the person possessing the right to use land but also the persons employed by him shall be authorized to shoot animals in this manner.

The competent local administrative authority is immediately to be informed of the killing of animals in this manner, and at my demand that the profits (tusks, horns, skins, feathers etc.) be given up.

This regulation will be in force and land under cultivation or otherwise in use is within a mile radius of a district covered by the regional directorate which issued this regulation.

In case it is considered it should be prohibited to otherwise injure or in places clearly marked as private property, against the will of the person possessing the right to use the land.

It is to recommend that the regulations should be without the knowledge of the persons having the possession of the land.

A license required before commencing to hunt animals is to be issued by the regional directorate.

The holder of such a license is to be granted authority to require for the capture of certain kinds of deer and antelope (Schilling).

Any holder of such a license is to be granted authority to shoot animals of Classes I and II (33) for a certain time without a license.

§13.

The capture of animals is considered equivalent to
shooting them with a shooting rifle.

§14.

The proper methods of killing live animals belong-
ing to Game is for the purpose of taking them, breeding
or rearing, requires special permission in addition
to the shooting license.

The Governor is authorized to assign certain areas to
privative persons for shooting game with the sole per-
mission of which anyone under obligations to the agreed
method of killing may have or special laws.

In the areas thus assigned shooting may be carried
on against the will of the owner or his agent with the permis-
sion of state authorities.

The hunting of animals is prohibited in areas of dro-
wing, declare by the Governor to be given for
the protection of water.

Hunting is prohibited in those reserves.

§15.

Because some kinds of animals become too plentiful in
certain reserves, the Governor is authorized to permit
hunting, under conditions to be fixed for each
reserve, and a sufficient number of these animals
shall be taken away from the area of the reserve.

A hunting license is required for killing down game

The shooting license may be withdrawn by order of the competent authority, if the person possessing it:

Should the shooting license be refused or withdrawn, an appeal may be made to the Government within 3 months beginning from the day when the Order was issued.

For each elephant killed or caught a fee of 100 R.P. is to be paid to the competent authority within 3 months after the elephant was caught or killed.

When this fee is paid it must be stated in what case the elephant was killed or caught.

The person who has killed the elephant, if he chooses instead of the fee, give one tenth of the elephant killed, provided that the living elephant least 10 years old.

2. 25 Rp. if the shooting is to be carried out with a breech-loader on animals belonging to Class I (13) in a certain administration district (District shooting license - Bezirks-Jagdschein).

3. 50 Rp. if the shooting is to be carried out by means of breech-loaders on animals belonging to Class I (13) in the Empire Protectorate (small shooting license - Klein-Jagdschein).

4. 750 Rp. if the shooting is to be carried out by means of breech loaders on animals belonging to Classes II (13) (large shooting license - Großer Jagdschein);
if the shooting is to be carried out by means of breech loaders on animals belonging to Class I (13) on a certain administration district after the license is made out (small shooting license - Klein-Jagdschein).

Persons not domiciled in the Protectorate must pay
an additional sum of 200 Rp. for the small shooting license.
The performance of muzzle-loaders or with a shot gun in the Protectorate is accounted equivalent to
a breech-loader.

The shooting licenses are made out in the local administrative units.

The shooting licenses are valid
for a year reckoned from the day on which they are made out
With the exception of the muzzle loader or shot gun
the shooting license is valid for one year.

Shooting Regulations for German East Africa. JAN 24 1910

1. 30928 JAN 10.

"Shooting" within the meaning of this Order is understood to be the shooting of all animals generally shot by the custom of the country within the districts declared to be game reserves (1), and outside the game reserves the shooting of the animals named below in § 2,3, in so far as these animals are to be considered in accordance with the legal provisions as not being the private property of any person.

2.

It is forbidden to shoot cranes, storks, spoonbills, marion-larks, secretary birds (Sekretärseidechse), tame (tame) and small owls, and bats to take up and wear the eggs of these birds.

For scientific or breeding purposes, the Governor may, under certain conditions to be determined by him, permit a certain number of these animals to be caught and killed, and to this also allow right of damage if the damage.

A shooting license (Jagdachein) is necessary in order to shoot the following animals:

Class I. All kinds of antelopes, including the cow, with the exception of the eland; all kinds of camels, buffaloes, zebus, maffebos.

Class II. The elephant, wild, giraffe, wild boar (Kugelboar), rhinoceros.

The Governor is authorized to change the above list by means of a public notice.


