I concur in the Earl of Creve's opinion, as expressed in paragraph 4 of this letter, that it is desirable that the British officers on the frontier should henceforth receive their instructions direct from the Secretary of British East Africa.

With reference to your letter No. 41187 of the 4th instant relative to the Southern Frontier of Abyssinia, I am directed by Secretary Sir E. Grey to transmit to you herewith, for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, copies of a telegram and a despatch which have been addressed to His Majesty's Minister at Adis'Ababa on this subject.

I am to add that Sir E. Grey entirely concurs in the Earl of Crewe's opinion as to the advantage of retaining Mr. Zaphiro's services in the administration of the frontier, if a place can be found for him.
