ledge the receipt of your letter ³⁰ 7158 of the 21st.ulti-
mo respecting the legislation in force in the British
East Africa and Uganda Protectorate on the subject of
ivory in transit.

The Earl of Crewe is aware that under Article 1
of the Anglo-Congolese Agreement of May 9th, 1906 the
Lado Enclave will revert to the Sudan on June 17th
proximo at the latest and it would appear convenient to
delay any alteration in the law in force in British East
Africa till after that date.
