SIR:-

I am directed by Secretary Sir E. Grey to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No. 11277/10 of the 22nd instant respecting the legislation in force in the East Africa Protectorate and Uganda as to ivory in transit.

I am to state in reply, for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that in view of the considerations put forward by the Officer Administering the East Africa Protectorate in his despatch of March 22nd, Sir E. Grey is prepared to concur in the proposal that the law of that Protectorate should be amended without delay so as to permit of ivory coming from territories other than Uganda, as well as ivory from Uganda itself, which fulfils the conditions of the Uganda law on the subject, being allowed to pass in transit through the East Africa

Protectorate.
