On receipt of your Despatch No. 173 of the 20th
 ultimo I addressed a communication to the French Govern-
 ment with regard to the question of the application at
 Marseilles of measures of quarantine to the Steamship
 "Gaulois" which is leaving Marseilles for London about November
 1st next having on board a large number of persons in the
 service of the West African Detachments, who are believed
 to suffer from leishmaniasis. It is stated that
 special quarantine measures will not be applied to the
 Steamship "Gaulois" by reason of the presence on board of
 no pests, and that the necessary instructions have been
 sent to the Director of the Maritime Service.

Par un Office en date du 20 septembre 1910

Excellence a bien voulu m'indiquer que le capitaine anglais se proposait de rassembler le vapeur "Guelph" devant partir de Bombay le 14 novembre pour Londres, un employé des travaux publics de l'Inde Orientale, vraisemblablement atteint de la peste, et a Guelph. En raison de l'escale a Marseille, les mesures sanitaires en présence a bord du navire et traiterait pour le service des mesures quarantaines.

Je m'empresse de lui faire connaître que l'Administration française a l'honneur de accueillir avec joie le retour de M. Paxton, et accorder la faveur demandée. Pour éviter tout malentendu, M. le Président du Conseil, Ministre de l'Intérieur, a son avis, a demandé au service sanitaire de la 6e circonscription de l'arrivée du navire en question et des circonstances dans lesquelles il assurera le transport des passagers signalés, réserve faite, bien entendu, des mesures sanitaires dont l'accomplissement pourrait être passible à tout moment de la part du navire de sa provenance.
