With reference to your letter 27340/1910 of the 10th ultimo enclosing a copy of the Customs Ordinance No. XIV of 1910 of the East Africa Protectorate, I am directed by Secretary Sir Edward Grey to state, for the information of the Earl of Crewe, that the question of applying the provisions of the Ordinance to French citizens and French protected persons is being carefully considered in this Department.

I am to request that in the meantime the authorities in the East Africa Protectorate may be instructed not to enforce upon French vessels those provisions to which exception is taken while the matter is under discussion with the French Government.
