With reference to your letter 25282/1910 of the 2nd August last I am directed by Secretary Sir Edward Grey to transmit to you herewith, to be laid before the Earl of Crewe, a copy of a Despatch from His Majesty's Agent and Consul General at Zanzibar enquiring what arrangements should be made to enable officers of the Zanzibar Government on leave or absence to travel by the steamers of the Union Castle Company without the possible sacrifice of a portion of their leaves.

Sir E. Grey would be glad to learn how this difficulty has been met in the case of officers in British East Africa.

Sir,

I have had the honor to receive your despatch No. 106 (33727) of the 31st August last inclosing a copy of the agreement concluded with the High Castle Steamship Company and ours, in accordance with your instructions, given the necessary directions for bringing into effect the provisions in respect of the carriage of Indian Government passengers and cargo.

In view of the fact that these steamer are to sail at intervals of twenty eight days the Acting Agent Administer asks that he may be informed what arrangements it is proposed to make in order to preclude the possibility of an official or steamer having to sacrifice

a portion of that leave so as to return here within the
period allowed him by the regulations and I should be
most obliged if you would favour me with a decision on
this point.

I would add that, if it is decided to deal with this
difficulty on lines similar to those to be adopted in
British East Africa it should be remembered that it takes
two more days to reach Zanzibar than it does Mombasa or
a difference of four days on the return journey.
