Sir,

I have the Honour to transmit herewith statements showing the result of the census which was taken on the 15th of September 1911 on the islands of Niue and Tokelau. It is to be seen from the total population table that the total population of the islands is considerably short of the estimate previously made and is probably not more than a quarter of a million. It is probable that owing to the difficulties of the islands to be mentioned and to the small number of the islands a certain number of natives are not included in the census.

That the total population of both islands does not

200,000. exceed two hundred thousand.

Besides being of interest in themselves these figures enable us to arrive at an approximate estimate of the birth rate. Taking the limit of the age of the children at twelve years and making an allowance of thirty percent for their mortality up to that age we arrive at the following results :-

No statistics are available here relative to other countries from which it would be possible to draw comparisons nor have we yet sufficient data in respect of deaths to be able to say whether the population as a whole is increasing or decreasing. But, if the basis from which the above calculations are made is approximately correct, these results confirm the opinions held by the medical and administrative officers as to the low birth rate in the town and also show that the population and

rapampa are increasing at a healthy rate.
