My Lord:-

With reference to Your Lordship's despatch No. 54 dated the 27th. June last relative to the issue of the Immigration Restriction Decree, I have the honour to report that the time of the Zanzibar Government officials has been so fully occupied in connection with the outbreak of bubonic plague in this port that it has so far been found impossible to put the Decree into force.

It is hoped, however, that with the arrival of the new Assistant Port Officer on or about the 10th. December these difficulties may disappear, and that the Decree may consequently be brought into operation on the 1st. January next.

It is proposed to publish the Decree about the middle of November in order that shipping agents in other countries may receive ample notice of its provisions.
