returns now being forwarded to the Colonial Office do  
not conform in each case with the returns  
prescribed in the Instructions to Officers in the  
Colonial Service, but this was presumably right  
itself in course of time.

The only action that appears to be called for in  
these papers is suggested by the recent arrangement with  
the Treasury under which the Abstract of Total Revenue  
and Expenditure mentioned in Sect 105 (a) (1) of the  
Instructions for Officers in the Colonial Service is to be  
sent each year, commencing with the year 1904-5, to  
the Treasury for information only, and I have accordingly  
drafted to the Treasury for London sending the  
Annual Abstracts in the case of the East African

Protectorate (26700) and of Uganda (26740). The remaining  
returns mentioned in the papers referred to at the  
beginning of this minute can I think be put by cables  
if they contain any statement of interest to the Dept.
