

Re:

We might now address the Ammrs. of the  
last Brown Note, with regard to whether have  
(1) schedules of despatches to C.O., (2) addls. of desps.  
telegrams, &c. from C.O. (3) schedules of unanswered  
despatches. Apart from the usefulness and checking  
power of these statements, it is well that the  
practice in these Notes shd. be in line with  
that in the Colonial Service generally, we followed  
a similar course with regard to P.C. Post.

Accordingly I submit draft for ammrs.  
I have added a para requesting the Notes  
to send home duplicates of their desps. we have  
and duplicate from this end. This practice is now  
in force in connection with most of the C.O.s, and the  
duplicates are, I believe, very useful.

I have the honour to address you with regard to the introduction in the Post. under your administration of certain regulations on the subject of the conduct of correspondence between the governors of Colonies and the Secretary of State, as it is desirable that the methods used in the Colonial Service should be adopted as far as possible in the Post. These regulations have reference to the transmission to the Colonial Office of the sealed packages

view to guarding against  
any undue delay in the  
conduct of cases & requests  
that you will, in accordance  
with Col. Regn. 177 A, send  
home by the first mail of  
every month

(1) A schedule of depts. used by  
you which have been more than  
a month in hands without an  
answer

(2) A schedule of depts. used by you  
which appear to have received a reply  
for more than one month after having sent  
specimens of these schedules  
transcribed.

4. It would be of  
convenience to this Dept  
if you would cause the  
headings

- (1) "East Africa Post"
- (2) "Uganda" to be  
transcribed under  
"Transvaal"  
written under "Transvaal"  
top corner of any sheet you  
may

may have pointed.

5 You will observe  
from the "Circular Deep of the  
7 Dec., 1849" I made referred  
to that the statements  
should not be numbered, or  
in any way indicated in  
the series of despatches.

6. I shall also be glad if

of this despatch, an account similar to
