My predecessor's despatch No. 496 of September 9th last advocated the purchase by the Government of the houses at Nairobi at present rented from Messrs. Jevan & Co., and informed Your Lordship that a sum of seven thousand, five hundred pounds would be inserted in the estimates for 1906-7 for this purpose. This sum was afterwards struck out as it was considered advisable to, as far as possible, reduce the sum to be asked for as a grant-in-Aid (vide my despatch No. 560).
