The Treasurer has pointed out to me that in Foreign Office despatch No. 343 of October 4th last, regarding Major Childs's appointment as Medical Officer in Bombay for the Protectorates reference is only made to a refund of half the fees in the case of officials (whose salaries are below one hundred and twenty rupees a month) applying for an extension of leave, and that no mention is made of medical fees being refunded in cases of first appointment, although it is laid down that candidates for Government employment must be medically examined.
