Sir,

I have the honour to receive the Marquesas of
transduce the despatches No. 553 of October 5th 1904 and 108
of 2nd March, calling for a report on the general
circumstances in which Mr. H. Tost's claim to the ownership
of a tract of land in it, and on the grounds of Sir C. Eliot's
refusal to recognize the right of the German East Africa
Company to a piece of territory about twenty five miles in
diameter in which is included the plot cultivated by Mr. Tost.

I am glad that the matter was first brought to my
attention notice in June when the Acting Sub-Commissioner
of Tanu, knowing that Mr. Tost was occupying certain lands
in his province, asked him for information as to how he acquired
them. I have the honour to transmit herewith Mr. Tost's
reply.

Martin informs me that when advising the late Commissioner on the subject he was under the impression that Tost's land was situated within the Sultanate of Zanzibar. The whole point then before him was whether Tost had any title; and it would appear that the German East Africa Company had relinquished their interests if any, that Tost was only at best a tenant at will of the Company, and that he rallied mainly on the ground of undisturbed possession for twelve years. The question whether the German East Africa Company had any rights to let or own any land in Witu or elsewhere was not brought forward until recently, and I do not think that Sir C. Eliot knew anything of their claim beyond what it was mentioned in the enclosures in Mr. Tost's letter.

Mr. Mikelson above referred to. I can find no record in the archives of the correspondence with Count Hermann von Schleswig-Holstein which took place between Sir C. Eliot and the German Vice-Consul on this subject.

I have the honor to transmit herewith a memorandum by Messrs. Martin and Hollie on the general circumstances of this case, together with a translation of an extract from American periodical, a map, and evidence.
