However I conceded to his wishes only to find that he had only recommended to my application at Tsavo. I have asked Mr. Underdown of Underdown and Grifton to call and ask you on the subject as he is supplying the capital to work the concession. It is easy to see about the payment of the machinery, as the land in question only averages about a ton of fibre to the acre and it takes 9 tons of material to make one ton of fibre, this with 20 miles of transport through difficult country does not leave much margin for profit.

I hope you will be able to rectify this for me, as I am very keen to start work at once and I have already spent a good deal of money in this country and am very interested in it.
