London.

The Memorial of Henry Plummer Ishmael sheweth:-

1. That your memorialist is a subject of the Shah of Persia. That he was born in Shiraz, Persia. That he is the son of David and Bhanu Ishmael who were both Persian subjects;

2. That your memorialist's name is Henry Plummer Ishmael. That he resides in Mombasa, British East Africa. That he is 23 years of age and is serving in the Customs Department of the East African Administration.

3. That your memorialist is not married, and has no children.

4. That during the period of eight years immediately preceding the application your memorialist has for five years been in the service of the Crown, as a Customs Officer, having entered the East Africa Government service on the 1st of April, 1895, and your memorialist intends to continue to serve under the Crown.

And your memorialist humbly prays that a certificate of naturalization as a British Subject may be granted to him.

And your memorialist as in duty bound will ever pray.

I swear that the statements contained herein are true to the best of my knowledge and belief.
