I have the honour to report that there has been a slight outbreak of plague in the Teita Hills, some 10 miles from Voi Railway Stetlon. As the outbreak appears to be confined to two or three villages, I have not considered it necessary to impose quarentine regulations either as regards Vci Railway Station or on the Voi Taveta Read; but precautions have been taken to prevent the disease from spreading.

Plague is said to be endemic in this part of 2. the Protectorate, both the Teits and Taveta having names for it in their dielect. The last known visitation,
