

My Lord,

With reference to Your Lordship's despatch

No. 405 of July 12th and to my telegram No. 98 of to-day's date, I have the honour to report that I have provisionally appointed Mr. W. G. Byron an Assistant in the Treasury to fill the vacancy caused by the transfer of Mr. Giles to the Transport Department.

2. Owing to Mr. Espie and Mr. James being on leave, the Treasury Department is at present understaffed, and as the framing of next year's estimates has been commenced, the Treasurer urgently requires assistance.
