My Lord,

I have the honour to submit copy of a letter from the Treasurer giving cover to the account of the Revenue and Expenditure of the Railway Zone since its formation up to the 31st March last, which, it will be observed, shows a net profit of £5,195-15-8.

2. I presume Your Lordship will not care to press the Treasury to depart from the principle which has been laid down that the profits on the working of the zone are to be set off against the capital charge of the Railway; and if this is so, I would suggest that the Crown Agents be instructed to transfer the amount of £5,195-15-8 to the Treasury, less the expense for management which should

During the year 1903-04 a special Railway Zone Rent Collecting Clerk was employed whose salary was charged against the Railway Zone account. Since March 1904, however, the rents &c., have been collected by the Land Office Staff together with the Protectorate rents and no charges for collection &c., therefore appear in the accounts.

I have therefore the honour to suggest that, if it is intended to continue to credit Railway Zone Revenue to the Capital Account of the Railway, the "percentage deduction for management" referred to in Foreign Office telegram No.44 of 7th March 1902 be now fixed by the Treasury.

But, in view of the comparatively small Revenue of the Railway Zone as against the Capital cost of the Railway, I have the honour to enquire whether the question may not be reconsidered and the Revenue in question credited to the East Africa Protectorate.

The existence of the Railway Zone as a separate estate necessarily complicates the question of apportionment, and partly out of the
