Sir,

In further reply to your letter, No: 15493/1906 of the 9th instant, I am commanded by the Army Council to inform you that No: 11.181 Sergeant G. Taylor, Royal Army Medical Corps, has been selected for employment as a Medical Dispenser in the East Africa and Uganda Protectorates Medical Service, for a period of three years from the date of arrival at Mombasa.

This Non-commissioned officer is at present serving with No: 10 Company, Royal Army Medical Corps at Chatham, and is very favourably reported upon by his Commanding Officer. He bears an exemplary character; is a Compounder of Medicines and qualified to assist in hospital duties, and post-mortem examinations; is a single man; 29 years of age; in possession of a 2nd class certificate of education; and medically fit. He has served in Egypt (Nile campaign), Malta and Gibraltar.

If the non-possession of a 1st class certificate of education is considered as rendering Sergeant

Taylor ineligible, another non-commissioned officer can be selected who is thoroughly recommended by his Commanding Officer on account of character and qualifications, although being a younger man he is probably not so experienced as Sergeant Taylor.

This Non-Commissioned Officer is No: 17,644 Sergeant H.B.Hart, who belongs to No: 9 Company, Royal Army Medical Corps, Colchester. He is a single man; a good character; a qualified compounder of medicines; and competent to assist in hospital duties and post-mortem examinations; is in possession of a 1st Class certificate of Education, and is medically fit. He is 22 years of age, and has not previously served abroad.

2. No further action is being taken pending receipt of the wishes of the Earl of Elgin on the subject of the certificate of education mentioned above.
