Sir,

I am directed by the Board of Education to acknowledge the receipt of the letter dated May 22, 1908, from Mr. Antrobus, and to say that the Board will be glad to place at the disposal of the Secretary of State the services of their Director of Special Inquiries and Reports (Dr. H. P. Heath) who is constantly engaged in selecting for the Colonial Office teachers intended to serve in the South African and other Colonies.

If the Secretary of State approves, Dr. Heath will proceed in the same way in connection with the post at Nairobi as he has been in the habit of doing in connection with educational posts in other colonies.

Before the Board could suggest the amount of salary which it would be necessary to offer a suitable candidate for the post in question, it would be desirable that they should be in possession of information upon the following points:— Whether the School is already in existence, and, if so, what salaries are paid to the teachers now serving; the size of the School and the conditions of work; the length of holidays; and whether the teacher selected would be provided with free board and residence or either. Information, also, as to climate, cost of living, and the like, would be useful.
