I understand that the original form of the app't on 32/7/77 was modified by Mr. Ellis's direction in the belief that the previous Assistant had been engaged on a agreement with the C.A. They were, however, app'ted in the ordinary way by letter from T.O., and there seems to be no objection to the adoption of the same course in this case, although the Customs Circular referred to a three year agreement.

If the C.A. do make an offer of it will have to be fully understood of the Customs Circular, and it seems better in cases where the intention is to make the app't permanent, notwithstanding a procedure adopted for cases where it is the intention that it should be strictly temporary.

With regard to these letters, when Mr.  
Dodd called the other day he pointed out  
the expense he was put to to obtain  
both for medical exam & for outfit, and  
asked whether he might not go  
second and receive the difference in  
cash - i.e. about £16. This, with the £30  
outfit allowance & the advance for which he  
asks, is surely more than he will need.

The expenses are certainly being paid  
over long at Cardiff, but we could not  
grant them in the case, say, of an Anti-Glotta  
where a total salary is the sum & who gets no  
increments, so in any case we should not  
give more than the 285. railway fare on  
medical examination and the 165. single railway  
fare (2<sup>nd</sup> class) up to Cardiff for Cardiff to London  
on departure.

As instructed by your letter of  
the 22<sup>nd</sup> Inst No 3466/1901, I proceeded  
to London and was duly medically  
examined on the 27<sup>th</sup> Inst.

I now respectfully request that  
the expenses incurred by me on that  
date be refunded. These amount in  
all to about £3 10s - Doctor fee  
£1 1s 0d, Railway fare 2<sup>nd</sup> class return  
Cardiff to London £1 8s 0d, and the  
balance of 10s being cost of subsistence  
and travelling whilst in London.

I beg to point out that the  
payment of medical fee was not

an admission on my part of  
accepting all responsibility of expense  
incurred, I simply obeyed the instruction  
of the Colonial Office in the first in-  
stance. From my point of view  
I could have been moderately examined  
here in Cardiff, just equally as well  
as in London and free from all  
expense.

I also assure Sir, that on the date  
of my departure for Mombassa my  
travelling expenses will be paid from
