I am directed by the Secretary of State for the Colonies to inform you that, in accordance with a recent regulation, Officers and European sub-officers of Colonial police forces on the various East and West African Colonies and Protectorates are now required to attend a course of instruction and training at the Depot of the Royal Irish Constabulary in Dublin, either on first appointment or during their leave of absence in this country.

The duration of the course and the number of subjects in which instruction will be given, will necessarily depend upon the capabilities and qualifications of each individual. It will, however, exceed six months.

I am accordingly to request you to report yourself to the Commandant of the Royal Irish Constabulary Depot, Phoenix Park, Dublin, on the ... of ...

While you are attached to the Depot you will be subject to the ... of the ... and discipline of Officers of the ... and liable to the same ...

The official fees for instruction are defrayed by Government, and you will be entitled, except in the contingency hereinafter stated, to receive salary and allowances during the course at the following rates:

1. Salary at the rate of ... under the ... and at the ... for the period of such ... of your leave of absence as may become necessary in order to enable you to complete the course.

(2) Lodging allowance at the rate of 20¢ per diem ~~inside~~

~~and of your having to make your own arrangements for quarters outside, and at the rate of 15¢ per diem if you are provided with quarters under the Dept.~~

(3) Traveling allowance of 5¢ per diem.

(4) ~~Travel~~ class railway and steamer passage between your place of residence and Wash, going and returning, on production of receipts in support of the payment made.

These receipts should be forwarded direct to the Comptroller for the Collection, who may be instructed to pay the amount due to you, together with the allowances above mentioned.

No claim for maintenance or for traveling expenses other than those specified, will be entertained.

5. The Secretary of State, however, reserves to himself the right of calling upon you to refund any portion of the allowances or traveling expenses paid to you in accordance with the terms of the foregoing paragraph, in the event of your failing to submit a satisfactory report at the termination of your course.
