The Nairobi Training Company has two good rifle ranges, one at Ruaraka and the other at Kikuyu, both of which have been improved during the year. The cost of ranges at Nairobi and at Thika is heavily paid by members of the Corps residing in their districts, and it is proposed to construct two ranges at these places, when the necessary funds are available.

Instruction of the Infantry Section practice on the Training Range, and the Military Range for Rifle Matches.

The Infantry Section has a good Range at English Point, consisting of four double targets placed in boulders at distances of 100, 200, 300 and 400 yards from the gun position. The advantage of this arrangement is, that no members have to fire their rifles away from, and outside, the range or within in a narrow area.

#### Marksmanship.

The interest taken in marksmanship has been fully kept up, and a large percentage of members who, previous to enrolment, had not used a rifle, have become good marksmen since earning the Capitation Grant.

The annual rifle meetings have been well attended.

The members have received every encouragement for proficiency in shooting and it is remarkable that although the corps has not been in existence for two years so many admirable marksmen should have been presented to it for examination.

I understand that several applications for membership have had to be rejected owing to want of rifles, on the other hand I observe that nearly fifty per cent of the members of the Hertford Section are still non proficient. It must be remembered however that, many of those men like the many from Head Quarters and have not found it convenient to leave their camp for the purpose of attending the annual meeting at Bedford.

The proposed amendment to Section 24 of the Bill, namely, if carried out, will enable members who desire to applying Abstainers to provide over sufficiently and to take their annual course in their own time.

#### The Hertford Section.
