World's News by Cable.

In the Commons.

Home Rule Amendment.

Rejected by a Large Majority.

(Beiter's Special to "E. A. Standard," London.)

Mr. Ian Malcolm, Unionist member for Croydon, moved an amendment to the address against Home Rule, the attainment of which would avoid one main reason for altering the constitution, but, which in the opinion of the House would be subversive of the unity of the United Kingdom.

Lord Hugh Cecil declared that a great many Liberals did not see the same sort of Home Rule as Mr. Redmond, Lord Cecil asked who would be disappointed in the future. Everything was to be concealed till the veto bill was passed—bill it would be too late to hinder frantic legislation. There were many ways of carrying out resolutions, there were means and ways which amounted to fraud (Cheers).

Mr. Asquith opined that everyone voting at the election in January, 1910, knew that if when the Liberals succeeded in clearing away the great obstacle to Liberal legislation, the first task would be full self government for Ireland, the Liberals never for a moment would retract or recede from that position. They could only arrive at a satisfactory solution of the Irish problem by an Irish Parliament, with an executive responsibility to it, which would do it purely with Irish affairs, subject always to Gladstone's condition, which was inelastic, that the supremacy of the Imperial Parliament must be maintained. This was the policy which had been applied to Canada and now to South Africa with so much success.

Mr. Redmond accepted absolutely Mr. Asquith's definition which he honestly believed would be a final settlement, adding, "We admit that we must accept Imperialism—Imperialism." He alluded to the Duke of Connaught's visit as the culminating point in the pacification of South Africa, which he believed would stand for all time as the greatest glory in the reign of King Edward. He asked, "Is it too much to hope that the present reign, which we hope may be long and glorious, may be made still more glorious by the visit of the Duke of Connaught to the Parliament of a friendly reconciled Ireland?"

Mr. Walter Long asserted that the case of South Africa was inapplicable to the question of Home Rule for Ireland, for the first act of South Africans was to unite not to separate. The attempt to force Home Rule on the Legislature in Ireland would necessitate employing the severest measures with a result something akin to civil war.

Mr. Churchill said the success of self government in South Africa was the principal reason for granting the like to Ireland. It was undoubted that a great change had come over English public opinion on the subject of Ireland. The thorniest Irish questions had been worked out and it was impossible that controversy could be revived with anything of its old bitterness. He warned the Conservatives that they should not again fail to rise to the great opportunity as they presented in connection with the granting of a constitution to the Transvaal.

Mr. O'Brien, the Independent Nationalist, said he would not cooperate in the present compromise, but he believed it was only a compromise so as to achieve a final settlement.

Sir E. Carson announced the Government of playing with loaded dice in sneaking the Bill through the House of Commons.

Mr. A. Birrell stated that Sir E. Carson's speech proved the hopelessness of any compromise.

Mr. Malcolm's amendment was rejected by 336 votes to 213 and the address was adopted.

The "Dunvegan Castle" arrived at Kilindini at about half past six a.m. on Tuesday, Feb. 21. The fact is that Mombasa folk are not quite sure as to the exact time, so completely were they taken by surprise. Though heartily glad to welcome His Excellency and Lady back again at any hour of the day or night, the citizens of the Port, however very busy, this week venturing a standing ovation as to the paucity of intelligence available for those interested in Overseas arrivals and it is considered that a wireless telegraphy station would by no means be an unprofitable extravagance. It is quite a common occurrence for ships to arrive and it is said especially Union Castle Liners, more or less unexpectedly.
