London, December 1.—A large crowd gathered at the Foreign Office yesterday for the signing of the Locarno Pact, which gives the official stamp to the League's guarantee of the frontiers of France, Germany, Poland and Czechoslovakia. The arrival of the German delegation was preceded by a formal reception at the Foreign Office, and the ceremony was followed by a dinner at the Carlton Hotel.

After the signature of the Locarno Pact, Dr. Arthur Neville Chamberlain, Foreign Secretary, said: "This is a happy moment for the Foreign Office. It has been a long time since we have had such a great occasion as this."

Dr. Neville Chamberlain, when the ceremony started, while a group of diplomats waited outside, said: "The Locarno Pact is a signal of good will between the British and French."

The letter of the King's Commissioner, Sir Edward Grey, to Dr. Louis Barthou, Minister of War in Germany, was signed in Berlin by Dr. Gustav Stresemann, Dr. Brügel, M. Bégin, Dr. Hirsch, Dr. Bérenger, Dr. Besson, Dr. Marigny and Dr. Dreyfus, and Dr. Gouraud, who had been present.

A PEN PICTURE.

This morning the Locarno Pact was signed and since the news was received in Paris, the Foreign Office was packed with diplomats, and looked like a great social gathering. The Foreign Office was at its best, and all the people there were thirty-two.

In the course of the negotiations after the signing of the Locarno Pact, Dr. Barthou, Minister of War in France, Dr. Chamberlain, Foreign Secretary, and Dr. Stresemann, Foreign Minister of Germany, were the chief speakers.
