





The accompanying plan of the new design of Nairobi is published at the instance of the public in connection with the forthcoming Nairobi Show. The plan should be studied carefully by those who intend to visit the show, so that they may be guided to the wide range of sections which will be a feature of the exhibition.

It should be noted that the only entrance to the grounds for motor cars and the public (other than the African natives) will be by the main gate.

All cars not entering the ground will be prohibited.

Cars and drivers must turn off the main Karate Road at the first intersection.

No motor cycles will be allowed

and no one except those competing in the races will be permitted to enter.

A charge of Shs. 2 per car will be made for all vehicles entering the grounds and the entrance ticket will be required to be exhibited in the cars in a visible place, when the vehicles are in the grounds.

Afternoons will be admitted to the grounds from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.

As the road between Westlands Railway crossing and the ground is narrow, the public are requested

to drive slowly and to observe a 10 m.p.h. limit to ensure the safety and minimize the dust nuisance.

The public are also asked to wear their Badges of Admission conspicuously while on the ground, so that the officials may be caused to inspect if officials have to approach the public for production of the badge.

Finally, the full responsibility of the arrangements involved lies with Agricultural and Horticultural Society to make the Show a success.



AUSTRALIA'S ATTRACTION
A Settler's Tour.

Mr. J. F. Englebrecht of Birkdale, Australia, who has been here since 1909, is dismantled, and the story of his life and work in Australia is a typical picture of the future of this country. He has had a varied career and he has had just about every experience in agriculture and industry. He has just returned to the Gold Coast, South Africa, after a tour of South Africa and Australia and will be back here again in October. Details of the principles of agriculture in Australia and the reasons why so many people leave Australia for America are given in his report. He says: "I have been in Australia for the first time in my life for a period of twenty or twenty-five days. Comptroller Manager here is a very good man and shows there is a certain amount of truth in what you may read in the papers that the country is not as good as it is reported." The report is based on detailed information and other particulars which were obtained by personal investigation.

Mr. Englebrecht says that the Australian Government offers the right type of land to settlers, and that the cost of living is lower than in America, but he has come to the conclusion that for the supply of wheat for farm purposes Australia is not the place after an examination of the conditions of the soil, climate, population and stock raising.

He studied the whole of the area down the coast from Port Lincoln, and found plenty of land available for sheep and cattle breeding, and suitable for arable cultivation.

He does not consider the farming of the extensive native pastures to be very profitable, as the land is too hilly and the terrain too rugged for work horses.

On the other hand, he found that the Aborigines had a great deal of knowledge of the land, and Mr. Englebrecht has in view the possibility of getting the Aborigines to help him to develop the land.

The land which the Aborigines occupy has not yet been taken up by the settlers, and Mr. Englebrecht has recommended by name says Mr. Bishop, that the Aborigines should be given a chance to prove their ability to handle the land.
