Cole's Deportation.

Regrettable Necessity.

Breakdown of Jury System.

(Reuter's Special to "E. A. Standard.") London, Sept. 10.

It is officially announced in London that at the direction of the Imperial Government the Governor of British East Africa has ordered the deportation of the Honourable Gallanath Cole, who was acquitted in July by a jury when brought before the High Court on the charge of the murder of a native. The "Observer" commenting on the subject, says it is to be expected that the responsible element in East Africa will approve of the action of the Imperial Government, though it might have been better to withdraw the right of trial by jury in East Africa in all cases between blacks and whites. The paper quotes the acquittal of the Moor who was charged with rape on a native girl in Natal and the acquittal of Lewis in Rhodesia, reported in the newspapers of August 16. It further insists on the absolute breakdown of the jury system in Africa and says that though there will be a good deal of personal sympathy, with Cole, on the grounds of Imperial policy the deportation will be recognized as a regrettable necessity.

Reuter's at Mombasa states that the Order in Council under which Mr. Cole will be deported will not be enforced immediately, but will be allowed a month for the settlement of his affairs.

The "Times," in its principal page, has a column from a correspondent defending Mr. Cole, especially in his relations with the natives, desiring that every party in the Colony will unite in opposing the deportation. The "Daily News" says that the Cole and Lewis cases have proved the breakdown of the jury system in black versus white cases.

The "Westminster Gazette" says that if Mr. Harcourt is not going to use his reserve powers when trial by jury fails, he may as well retire from the business of Government. In paragraph as a settler is John guided by a good previous record, his example is clearly so much more dangerous. This journal is glad to find that the Lewis case of Rhodesia has caused the great re-arranging of the seats of both parties in South Africa. It concludes that shooting at night was first confined to offences against women, next it spread to solicitation, and then to sheep-stealing, and that it is inevitable, if that which law must be stopped at the beginning.

The "Globe" state that Cole was "but following the rough and ready justice custom in all new countries." It says that in the early days in Cape Colony the British sentimental administration endeavoured to prevent such methods, and the result was the great trek, and after a period of bitterness the local administration was forced to allow the resumption of the practice, for which Cole was being exiled, in order to protect property.

The "Morning Post" says that bringing illegality to the aid of outraged justice is no remedy for the failure of the jury system in East Africa, and to use the Governor's warrant to deport a man who by the law is innocent, constitutes an undesirable precedent for State C's similar rule.

The "Daily Chronicle" says that Mr. Harcourt's action in the Cole case is expeditious and just. He did well to show that the Government has no respect of persons in such cases.

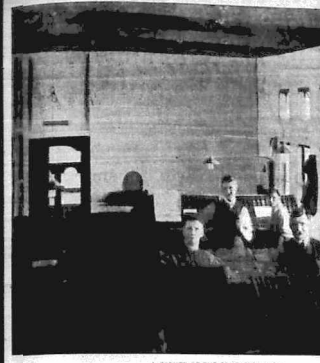

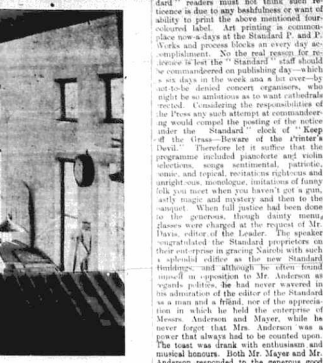

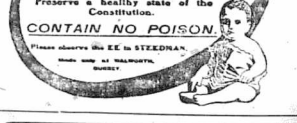
