MR. CHURCHILL "TELLS HIS STORY."

Labour & Liberal Leaders' Criticisms
and the Chancellor's Answer.

(Dr. Winstanley.)

Highbury, Sept. 27.—The Prime Minister, Mr. Churchill, opened the Debate on Tuesday evening, and he said that the miners had got their own problems right and the field a political one. representing with the Railways. These have been referred to in the article.

Its Assistant Land Officer reported that the Government's interest in the area of the Municipality was very slight, and that the Municipality was not concerned with the Control of Land in the area close associated with the Municipal Office. The area concerned had been granted by the Government to the Municipality.

A considerable expenditure of time and labour has been incurred in assisting the Municipality in this way, and it is now the desire of the Government to have the Land Department take over the task in order. A letter has been sent to the Municipality asking for a revaluation of sites in the area concerned.

The area concerned is situated at Taita Hill, and is bounded by the River Chagua and its tributaries.

The areas concerned are almost completely covered by the work within the Township.

The area concerned is to be invaluable in the present and future development, and so long as Government retains control of the land, the value of ground taxation will probably require to continue.

THE RATING SYSTEM.

7. I consider the present system of rating of land values should be maintained and should not be supplemented by a tax on land values. It would be shown that in order to produce the same revenue as the site value rate should not require the site value rate to be increased by a further amount. The proposed increments after allowing for the usual deduction of 25%.

Reserves for this view—
(a) Any change of an accepted system of rating is disturbing.

(b) The proposed system is equivalent in that the benefit is adjusted to the benefit received.

(c) The proposed system is intended to reward building activities.

(d) The proposed improvements values are dependent on other factors.

(e) Rating land values tends to prevent the holding up of land values, and the proposed system of rating higher prices in consequence.

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8. The Committee has recommended that all land rates in the area concerned should be reduced by 25%.

The payment claimed in any case should be measured only on land held by Government, and by Government only on the basis of valuation.
