of Kenya, Uganda, Tanganyika
and Zambia will open this morn-
ing at the Law Courts in Nairobi
under the chairmanship of the Attorney General of Kenya. Northern Rhodesia has

"East African Standard" Scheme.

TWO ALTERNATIVE DEPENDENT ON MAINTENANCE OF RESIDENTIAL SEGREGATION.

A Single Body or Urban District Council.

ESSENTIAL THAT LOCAL AUTHORITY MUST BE ALLOWED TO USE ITS POWER.

The "East African Standard" has not submitted to the Local Government Committee a memorandum on the subject of local government for Nairobi and District.

The memorandum states the view that the whole area must be taken in as one but that the local authority should be set up for the suburbs.

If segregation in the residential areas outside the township can be maintained, it is agreed that the position would be met by a single body or an Urban District Council.

The word system is used as the basis of representation.

The memorandum deals with the direction of common services such as roads, sewers, planning and public health.

Control by Government should be demanded.

The Local Government Committee, and the evidence of Mr. H. V. Morris, the Minister of Home Affairs, has been gathered from the fact that representations have been made to the Government in Nairobi that the grip of the Corporation on the city is too strong.

The funding principles should be applied to planning, to construction, a simple system, the minimum of regulation, and the maximum of freedom to the corporation to avoid duplication of controlling authorities while creating a single, distinct, responsible authority.

A single body or an Urban District Council has been planned on a project basis in the eyes of Government.

Nairobi and District presents the only new area ready for major development, and the corporation able to undertake definite responsibility for the welfare of a comparatively small area already enjoying certain facilities.

Local Government, included in the memorandum, has the experience of Municipal control in the country.

It has been suggested that the Corporation should be given a period of trial, and it has suffered in consequence particularly through the influence of the railway and other commercial interests, and influences and interests which are not in the best interest of the town.

The experience of the Corporation, and the opposite unwillingness of the railway to let go of its grip on the leading business.

There has been a conflict in the settlement of problems between the Corporation and the Government in housing schemes involving the sale of land.

There has been a further complex situation where the Corporation and the Railways were involved.

The Council had to look after the affairs from an Advisory Committee.

It was not until 1924 that a body for public work was born.

On progression to the introduction of the site Value Tax for instance, the Corporation had to give up the right that the scheme came under the panel of Ministers of State for the time being.

The Corporation, in the beginning, had no power to do anything.
