IMPLICATIONS OF THE STRIKE-LAW.

BEST *Business Men* is
Free from Treasury Control.

POST AND TELEGRAPH EMPLOYEES.

The Legislative Council discussed at length on Monday evening the proposed bill to prohibit strikes and lockouts, in which business should participate in the dispute, and to give the Treasury control or rule the strike law and related legislation.

LAW DEFENDERS' VIEW.

In the Legislative Council, Mr. Justice G. C. D. Smith, for the Colonial Secretary, said:

"The Government has undertaken (1) to undertake negotiations for obtaining a revised law, and (2) to consider and for the following objects do not part."

SCHEDULED:

- (a) Four new general deep-water ports, namely, Port of Uganda, Port of Mombasa, Port of Dar es Salaam and Port of Kisumu, each to cost £130,000,000.

(b) Additional lights, buoys, other craft equipment on existing wharves, port areas, etc., £200,000,000.


