The article on this series has been concluded by a Kenya Chaplain who has endeavoured to express the mind of the average Christian regarding Christianity, his or her difficulties, and the personal call to enter professes of faith.

"If there is a 'God'—such as infinite space, it follows that He is a God of infinite power. If God is a God of infinite power, then He must be infinite in all His works. What does the word 'infinite' mean?"

"There were contained in the article written by a Kenya Chaplain, the following: 'The author sees the view of a man who does not do much for his God, but who wants much from His God; he wants to be rewarded by the Christian Church, and who is still furthering the cause of God in this world. That is, God is not a personal God.'

### THE DEATH DUTY LAW ANOMALY.

#### Another Case Comes to Light.

It is now known that unless the Government amends the Act, the death duty will affect the estates of Kereys' estates and the result will be that the executors will have a very harassing task while the small estate will be liable for the death duty on the value of the property held in South Africa and India. The death duty is charged at a rate that is higher than the rate of inheritance tax, so that the executors will be called upon to pay a double tax on the same value. Some countrymen will not be able to afford the extra tax. It will be recalled that a few months ago the death duty was introduced and suggested the need for a change in the law to prevent it.

It will be recalled that the case referred to at last year's meeting of the Chamber of Commerce was that of the Kereys' estate.
