In glorious perfect weather and on a good wicket Australia commenced the first innings with five wickets down in the first hour. The first wicket was well deserved victory by 500 wickets to 53. The S. A. were very lucky indeed but were not a substitute.

On the following day in glorious summer weather with an abundance of about 19,000 people and on a perfect pitch the English team obtained the innings, the first wicket being lost in the 13th over when the Australian finished their innings with 147 runs. Trumper made 113 by all round game. Trumper's 100 runs in 225 minutes. Minns scored 50 hitting six fours and five sixes in 111 minutes batting.



A further experimental area of two acres was similarly planted at Alexandria and the other one. Considering the qualified treatment of the bearing properties of the cotton proved good, though no records of the actual yield were kept. The several experiments and the appearance of the stunted unproductive cotton plants on the totally unimproved sections afforded a most striking object lesson of the enormous and valuable waste the territory possesses in the Jubah river, which is only awaiting exploitation. Mr. Travell strongly advises the planting of the seedlings of the cotton on the various plots as it appears. Alexandria and Halford are both subject to high winds. Careful work is commencing the fibrous part and seed plants would suit the purpose admirably.

The cotton crop returns by the various experiments, over 150,000 lbs. was shipped by the returning steamer with the object of bringing it to the S. B. H. for distribution to Merchants.

The news from Bulmeria where experiments had also been carried out on behalf of the department was of quite a satisfactory nature, though the work was hampered by inferiorly demonstrated by contamination of the soil for cotton growing, a sound financial proposition. Unfortunately, Mr. Payne had to leave his station during the departmental experiment, but he is believed to be well satisfied with the results which he intends to plant a considerable area with cotton for the next season.

Experiments were kept at Halford on a somewhat more extensive scale, in all 15 acres were planted in plots of 100 yds. the object of ascertaining whether the crop springing in a particular would not give better results. Thanks to Mr. Alexander's great efforts in so arranging and irrigation efforts the arrangements have so far been conducted without any serious hitch. Picking the cotton was well progressed. Halford's soil and Mr. Alexander's experience of the soil yield from the several plots of about approximately 25,000 lbs. That gentleman will report to the Agricultural Department in a better day and mention in it is understood that the cotton yielded in the several plots was of the individual plants as of Alexandria, being able to stand up against the action of the wind and pressure. The cotton stands proved troublesome in Halford as the cotton was not in condition. On the English side Mr. Pohl considers the prospects for cotton are more favourable higher up the river, especially at the Alexandria Station, further along at the Italian side of the river, while the climate is of exceptional size and the young trees are generally healthy and vigorous. More data is required as regards water, and while the trees are not growing so well, but the success in the rubber is likely to succeed in the low lying land. Mr. Powell ventures opinion that years will prove even more favourable than the trials made in the past. The value of the water is given great importance at Alexandria, seeing that water plants are killed from the excess of water. ### Against Native Squatters

A Bill to regulate the residence of natives on land in certain portions of the Union of South Africa and prohibit the unauthorized settlement of natives on any land has been published in a recent "Gazette Extraordinary" of the Union. The Bill provides that any portion of the Union may be divided into areas in which shall be a Native Settlement Board, and where a Divisional Council exists in such area that Council shall be the Native Settlement Board, otherwise it will consist of the Magistrate, the Field Cornets in the area and two other persons. Every proprietor in such area shall render to the Magistrate a return of all natives residing on his lands. Natives who are not owners of land, or servants, are classified as squatters. The Native Settlement Board may issue or refuse certain certificates authorizing residence of natives as squatters. The proprietors shall pay 50s. per year for every squatter upon land personally occupied by the proprietor and for other land 75s. No proprietor shall allow a native to reside on his property longer than one month without the certificate referred to Natives on unoccupied Crown Lands are required to obtain an annual squatter's license, at an annual fee of 75s. Natives found residing upon unoccupied Crown Lands, or other land, contrary to the provisions of the Act, may be required to depart from same on a penalty not exceeding

£20 or three months. After the commencement of the Act it shall not be lawful for more than five natives to acquire in common proprietorship any immovable property, except with the approval of the Government, or in such parts of the Union as may be defined by Parliament.
