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**WEATHER AFFECTS
UGANDA COTTON CROP.**
Prospects of Much
Smaller Crop.

[From Our Own Correspondent.]

The hot and dry weather continues all over Uganda, and cotton growing for some time yet is not in the trees despite considerable rainfall. The vegetable gardens, vegetable and mills are becoming erratic in the towns.

Cotton has practically ceased in the Eastern Province and is still in the same position that the crop was last year. One grower in Mbale said recently:

"We have only bought about one-third of their total crop. In Tanga and Bokoko usually extends well into March but this year it is still early and the cotton action is finished and there is no second crop. This is the first we have experienced from the middle of January. The failure of the season is due to the same old story of the weather being hot and dry. The heat does not allow the plants to flower and does not give them a chance of flowering again. As I write before the season started, light showers were reported in most parts of the country and could keep them off again."

Agriculture.

THE DEVELOPMENT BY
WHITE SETTLEMENT.

Farmers are generally busy at
farm work and the agricultural prospects of the
country for the year 1927-28, and
the export of maize has surpassed
previous records. The quantity
exported in the year ended
February 28th was 860,000 cwt.
while gold exports were for
the same period £1,000,000.
Exports of maize increased
during the eight months that we
exported during the previous
year, and the total value of
the Railway conveyed 81,230
cwt. of maize in the year
ended February 28th, and June
28th, 1926, 83,500 cwt. This
affords a good indication of
the growth of maize production
in the country.

The Report of Mr. A. D. Lewis,
Director of Irrigation, shows that
the value of South African maize
imported into Uganda in 1926-27
was £2,017,000, an increase
over the previous year of 10 per cent.
However, settlement is holding up
well and has not suffered in
any way.

In 1926, 3,532,100 acres were
under cultivation, and in 1925-26
the area was 3,271,000 acres.
The average yield per acre
increased during the period
by 15 per cent.

The most noteworthy increase in
average yield was in 1925-26, when
it was 3,271 acres—or an increase
of 20 per cent. In 1926-27, the
yield was 1,055, while there was a still
larger proportionate increase in the
area under cultivation, 13,130 acres
being added to the land under
cultivation during the period.

WHEAT PROCESS.

The position of the coffee crop
with which there is also a prospect of
the introduction of cotton, makes
the development of agriculture
in a healthy keeping pace with

the wheat industry, which
is considerably more advanced
than the coffee crop. The
Government has taken a
considerable interest in the
planting season, and has
been instrumental in getting
the position of the coffee
crop into a better state of
development. The coffee
crop is now in full bearing
and is being harvested at

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
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



CONTROL OF FIREARMS IN KENYA.

Registration Rules under the Ordinance.

The Acting Governor of Kenya has made and issued twelve "Official Gazette" copies of rules applying to the registration and control of arms and ammunition in Kenya, also their import and export.

For their export to a place in a protected zone shall be made by a D.C.O. and without the payment of a D.P.L.; unless bona fide required for defence or police purposes, the Commissioner of Police or a Customs Collector or a D.C.O. can license arms and ammunition for the export.

On importation by a non-commissioned person they may be deposited in a public office or sent to a storage warehouse whilst a licence to remove them is obtained. All must be registered.

No person shall import into the Colony any rifle with a nose of 360, unless such rifle has been previously registered under the Rules, without the express sanction of the Governor.

The station rest in the sole-dubbed publications shall be given for every case or box of ammunition, and for each gun or pistol 10 cents, and for every firearm per week or part of a week 25 cents.

No permit for withdrawal shall be granted until all documents, including the permit to import, are in the possession of the controller, and no permit to withdraw the arms may be dispensed of by the authority. Only the controller may issue a permit for withdrawal of arms apparently intended for warlike purposes.

REGISTRATION OF LIBRAIRS.

Under the title "Registration of Arms" already in Colony's law, any person who is engaged in having any arms or ammunition in his possession at the controller, or at the controller's office, shall within three months from the coming into force of the Rules, produce to the controller a certificate which he receives on application and marking. The D.C. may dispense with the production of any certificate if he is satisfied that correct and sufficient particulars have been given to him.

A District Commissioner shall have power to require any person to produce any arms or ammunition in his possession, and shall, as soon as possible, report to the controller or the Secretary or to the central office when so established. Such a report may be made orally or in writing, or by telegram, or by letter, or by telephone, or by any other means as he may consider appropriate.

Under similar conditions as above, without assigning any reasons, receive any arms held by any person in his possession. When any arms or ammunition are seized, they may be issued to natives for their uses and ammunition may be supplied to them for the use of other servants as he may consider appropriate.

The fee for an arms licence shall be Shs. 5, and every arms licence shall expire on the thirty-first day of December next following the day of issue.

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

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


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
