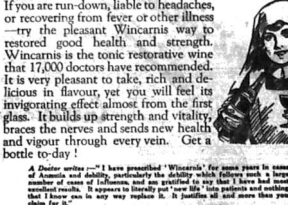

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY'S FUTURE SHOW POLICY.

Alternate Years at Nakuru and Eldoret.

A meeting of the Council of the Agricultural and Horticultural Society of Kenya was held at the Agricultural Department's Offices on Wednesday, August 23.

The following members were present: Lt. Col. W. K. Tucker, C.I.B.E., T.D., (Acting President) in the Chair; Lt. Col. G. A. Watson, Hon. Member, C.I.B.E., I.R.S.O., Mr. Deane Shaw, Mr. J. K. Wain, The Hon. Comptroller Haver, Mr. J. H. D. Heales and also by invitation the Hon. Major Robertson Eastwood, I.R.S.O., and Mr. H. Brassey Edwards with the Secretary as attendants.

An audited profit and loss account for the recent East African Show was presented to the meeting and revealed a very satisfactory financial result. The Council decided to transfer from the General Building Fund to the Nakuru and Eldoret Building Funds such sum as would wipe out their respective outstanding deficits. This represented an amount of Shs. 2004.15 in the case of Nakuru, and Shs. 2495.05 in the case of Eldoret.

Future Shows.

Proceeding to discuss the Society's policy with reference to future shows the following resolutions were carried unanimously.

"This Council is of the opinion that a Show should be held at Nakuru and Eldoret in alternate years and that in view of the fact that a Show was held at Nakuru in December last the next Show should be held at Eldoret in March 1928. In the event, however, of the Nakuru Area Committee expressing a strong desire for an attendance one day Producers Show the member met, the Council would give every consideration to their wishes."

The Council further records their intention to hold a Central Show in Nairobi annually at a time of year to be given further consideration."

Resolutions relating to thanks were passed to the East Africa Veterinary and Cattle Raisers' Association, the Kenya Horticultural Society, the Kenya Horticultural Society and the Pony Breeder's Society, their co-operation and assistance in connection with the recent Show. The Council also realized what a large measure of any success which the Show may have achieved was due to the unstinted support which they were accorded by those bodies.

CATTLE CONFISCATION CASE RECALLED.

Full Text of the Appeal Judgments.

The Chapwain cattle moving case has assumed considerable interest among the stockowning community in Kenya.

Some doubt having been thrown on the accuracy of the report of the case, the Standard has perused the records.

It would appear that although Chapwain was convicted by the Magistrate at Kiunga, no fine was imposed, but the cattle were ordered to be returned to the owner of the Court.

appellant states that this order of confiscation refers to as many as 50 cattle and that there was no question of disease involved in the case. Such an order cannot stand. Quotation from Decisions of Animals Ordinance.

(1) Whenever any person shall have been convicted of an offence against this Ordinance, the Magistrate may, in addition to or in lieu of imposing any fine, order that the animal, or all the animals, be returned to the owner of the Court.

(2) Whenever it shall be reported to a Magistrate that any animal has been seized and detained under the provisions of this section but that the owner of the animal is unknown or cannot be found, the Magistrate may, if satisfied by evidence on oath, that the owner of the animal is an offence against this Ordinance has been committed, order that such animal be forfeited.

Provided, however, that no order shall be made under this subsection unless the owner (if his name and address are known) of such animal shall have had an opportunity of appearing before the Magistrate to show cause why such order should not be made.

(3) A Magistrate, whenever he has been satisfied that it is reasonable to require that an offence be committed in respect of any animal, may, in addition to or in lieu of the provisions of section twenty, may order that the owner of such animal shall be liable to the Chief Veterinary Officer such sum as he may consider reasonable to cover the expense connected with the removal, confinement, or the place of detention and the keep of such animal during such detention, and that unless such sum be paid the animal shall be sold, or otherwise disposed of, at such price as the animal be for sale.

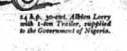

LION MENACE IN MASAI COUNTRY.

Game Department Experts Specialist to Reduce the Danger.

DAYLIGHT ATTACKS ON MAN AND BEAST.

(“E. A. STANDARD” SPECIAL).

The Game Warden's office in Nairobi might quite properly claim to be the headquarters of romance in Kenya Colony. What is not for a single moment meant to convey that it is a place where the tall stories, so often related by an amateur hunter to his animal, are manufactured. Nor is there much in the office itself to suggest romance, beyond a few trophies; and yet the business like files which form part of the equipment must contain hundreds of true stories, only a proportion of which find their way into publicity via the delightful reports on the Department with which Captain Ritchie from time to time brightens up official publications.

To most people at all interested in wild life there is nothing more fascinating than stories of lion-hunting and the fact that they come from an official source does not in the least detract from their interest, whilst it does lend them an importance which they could not otherwise possess.

THE GAME WARDEN'S EXPERIENCES.

Through the courtesy of the Game Warden, the Standard is able today to publish an account of the measures which are being taken to combat the lion menace in the Masai country.

The disappearance of the so-called King of beasts have caused anxiety for some years past in the Masai country, especially near the Tanganyika border. Various methods of dealing with the problem have been suggested by people in the spot, such as poisoning the gun traps and gun traps that all of them have proved useless. In some cases for the lack of success through these methods in the course of many years, such as when the lion was shot in Kenya, and it was found in this district; and experience proved that it was they who fell victims to the snare.

It was felt therefore, that short of exterminating the hyenas in the area, it would be difficult to reduce the lions to any extent by any time-consuming method. It was, however, given it is possible to exterminate the hyenas—this and this is an aspect of the solution of the animal world which is not generally known—they are a very valuable element in maintaining the balance of nature and preventing an undue increase of plains game.

The Danger Explained.

In an interview with Captain Ritchie yesterday the Standard learned that the main reason for the increase in depredations by lions was the abolition by Government of the snare system as a result of which the Masai were deprived of their white oxen and shields and the young men ceased to live together in Momo camps. This necessarily meant a decline in the number of lions which were shot, and conditions became appalling in the area which found this was a comparatively easy matter. So much so that, since there was no great change attendant upon the removal of the snare system. Observation has proved that the lions are the biggest nuisance during the dry times of the year when the Masai drive in with their flocks and herds to the waterable places. Incidentally they face the greater part of the lion's attack in the districts south of the Masai's territory. In these districts most of the railways the only habitat in which the lions have been reported to be in the vicinity of Nanyuki, where recently they were shot by a lion.

Many of the attacks on cattle reported for some time past have occurred during the dry time. The reason for this is that the cattle have been driven by their keepers into scattered bush country in the search of grazing. Since lions in this area do not for the most part have any permanent lairs, but lie up in the bush which cover miles of open country, they have found it very simple to proceed upon their prey suddenly and to finish it before, snare could be taken to keep them off.

Natives Attacked.

In the way, within recent months not only cattle have been killed, but also natives have been wounded. In the case of the latter, the lion has been the cause of the trouble. The Game Warden came to the conclusion therefore that there was only one really effective way of coping with the trouble, and that was to hunt lions with dogs during the hours of daylight. This was the solution decided upon by Captain Ritchie after a long time, and he has been successful in his plan. The Game Department have been fortunate in securing the services of Mr. J. A. Hunter of the Masai country, who is engaged to work in the Game Reserve for four months, with an extension if necessary, with the object of killing lions and trapping them during the dry time and in places where the latter are more likely to be seen. He will use traps and also shoot a certain number of lions which will be the property of the Masai. He will work as far as possible under the instructions and in accordance with the

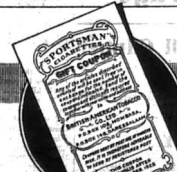

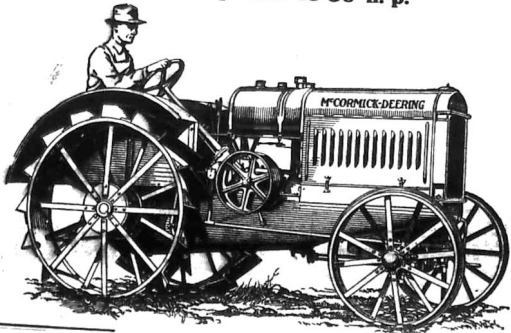

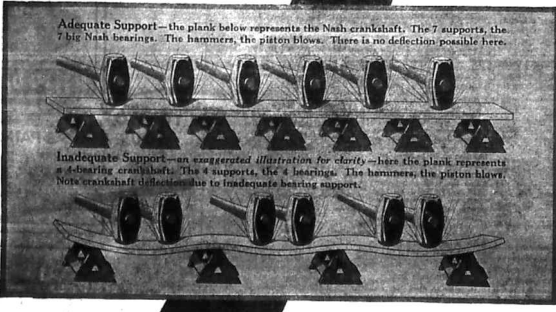

AGRICULTURE

PRUNING OF COFFEE.

The Single Stem System.

On the subject of the single stem system of pruning Mr. J. J. For Tranch in his bulletin entitled "Coffee-Pruning in French Guiana" and observations on trials states:

All suckers and secondary growth within a radius of the main stem should be removed. From the second year onwards, they are trained on the secondaries, but they need not necessarily be left with the same rate as the secondary ribs which are trained on the primary. The idea is to keep the structure of a foundation for the future bearing wood. As the plant gets older, the tertiary becomes the main bearing wood. It is pruned so as to allow a free passage of air to pass under each tree. Wood cutting on the ground takes hours per acre and necessitates to cut away all old and "straggling" wood to encourage the growth of new wood and to stimulate crown growth. Better quality coffee is produced on new wood and the picking can be more easily carried out.

The more advanced stage of pruning states when the trees have become deteriorated and require heavy pruning the first operation will be very heavily pruned to cut down to within 12 inches of the ground. All the primaries are cut back to within 12 inches of the main stem. It is always advisable to cut back a young shoot and all weak secondary and tertiary stems taken off. "Fencing" or "stick pruning" is not advised except under very special circumstances. The operation is carried out by cutting down the primaries to within 12 inches of the main stem. There are many disadvantages against "fence stick pruning," possibly the most important are—

(1) The heading which is made difficult and expensive owing to the considerable amount of the new wood growing inwardly and outwardly.

(2) The growth of germinal twigs is encouraged.

(3) It takes a few years to get the frame-work of the tree reformed and it is most tedious in the operation. This operation should be carried out once a month before the rains, or, as in the case of "stumping" when there is less growth.

Stumping.

Stumping should be done with a sharp saw or with a machete of 18 to 20 inches in length. The latter is used for this purpose in Central America and has great advantages over a saw. The wounds are much cleaner and the operation is very quiet. Any cutting of the operator which may be made by careless handling of the saw and all saw cuts should be trimmed with a sharp knife. On no account should any stumping or pruning be carried out on trees which are in a state of "die-back." They should be allowed to completely recover from any state of "die-back" before the best time of the year for stumping is chosen. "Die-back" is a growth, which in a mild or a severe climate is about a month before the rains. In a very old climate it would not necessarily be a month before the rains but during the coldest months when growth would be very slow. If stumping is carried out when the flow of sap is high there will be much loss of sap and probably a large percentage of the stumps would die. However, if stumping there will not be such a risk in leaving the tree in with a few days in it there is no risk that it is stumped or in a state of "die-back."

The cut should be made at an angle of 45 deg. and the saw should cut immediately below the cut so that the cut will be near the line of flow of sap into the new shoot, and a callus may form more rapidly to heal the wound. If the sap flows freely from the wound it is advisable to apply some protective covering.

When coffee has been allowed to go into a neglected condition and requires reconstruction, a Botanical Programme should be carried out. To remedy any further damage it is desirable; it can never be too late to plant, unless wood, however, plants, unless wood, however, must be removed before the bushes can benefit from treatment of the soil.

When "heading" or "cutting" as it is sometimes called, is carried out, it is best not to use a knife or a saw, as it is possible to cut back over the top of the tree, which is the most normal and secondary die back or has a horizontal direction. If a primary branch is cut back, it is possible to cut back over the top of the tree. Trees in blossom should not be handled until the flowers have set. In districts where there is a prevalence of "die-back" stumping should be carried out with a sharp knife, the object being to keep the tree more dense with branches in order to protect the crop from severe hail damage.

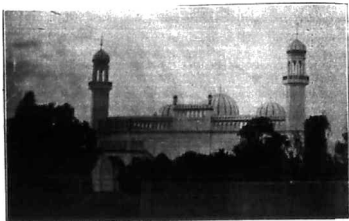

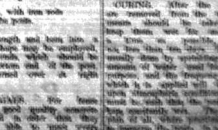

MR. SASTRI'S MISSION IN SOUTH AFRICA.

An Appeal on Behalf of Indians Abroad.

The City Hall, Maritzburg, was packed to the doors recently by a great gathering of Europeans who had come to hear Mr. Sastri, the Agent for India in the Union of South Africa, South Africa and the British Empire. Scarcely have so many people assembled in Maritzburg and seldom has an African dispersed so deeply impressed by an orator's personality and message.

The British Empire Mr. Sastri declared itself alone, was the one true promise of peace in a disunited Commonwealth to all its constituents and benefit by its common achievements, was a destiny of which any race might well be proud.

India was drawn towards Britain by feelings of affection, concern and gratitude, which were impossible to describe and, though force had played a large part in the early relationship of the two countries, the had had time were more forgotten, and thinking Indians remembered only the glory and privileges attaching to membership of the Empire. From the former perspective, born after British rule had been firmly established, shuddered when they thought of the terrible fate India

had escaped by belonging to the Empire.

"Occasionally hear," said Mr. Sastri, "of disturbing and disruptive movements within India, but such movements are inevitable when racial relations are still in process of adjustment. The Indian people dare not contemplate the consequences of the withdrawal of Britain's hand from the helm of the Indian Empire."

The British Raj.

In India, he said, British rule stood for the reign of constitutional law and freedom as opposed to absolute personal Government. The British Raj was undoubtedly variously popular among different sections of the population, were being moulded to one pattern of British rule, which implied complete freedom and an independent Government under a common flag. Political freedom would always be easily granted up to all who loved the Empire, as he himself still most frankly wish an enormous step in the national life of India really was.

Referring to the anti-cooperation movement, Mr. Sastri said that Mr. Gandhi (of whom he was not a follower) was certainly being misrepresented by interested parties. It would surprise his audience to learn that, during the development of the Indian National Congress, when revolutionaries favouring an extreme course, were denounced by disaffected minorities, Mr. Gandhi had always spoken strongly in favour of the Imperial connection.

Indians Abroad.

The loyalty of Indians, however, had often been endangered by the treatment accorded to them in the parts of the Empire other than British or India. He could state the feelings of white people who found themselves surrounded by people of another race and complexion, but he appealed for a new spirit. The rights have and legal right to impose restrictions on those fellow citizens, but it had been recognised, even before there got a little worse that a legal right was not always a moral right. Let each citizen of the Empire regard himself as a vehicle of peace and goodwill, but the spirit of the Empire, and the law of the land, be obeyed by the peaceful subdivisions of the Indian had not yet attained full Dominion status, but she would do within a very few years now, and every her people could not by demanding the rights of fellow citizens. The treatment accorded Indians in South Africa would certainly be a model for the whole of the Empire, and would be a permanent institution, even India's own Imperial status.

Let them never yield to the passing temptation of conventionalism and those who endanger that great spirit of Empire.

The case of Mr. Sastri's speech was the spirit for a remarkable occasion, which continued even after the hour had expired, and Mr. Sastri for his address.

I have for many years been an earnest advocate of Federation, and also of what is now called the dual policy. I was no nothing but good resulting from any measure that gives the white local residents some definite responsibility, with proper safeguards, for carrying out right policy. This would in my judgment undoubtedly be the reasonable wish of the native population, who also clearly prefer the decisions of those having actual experience of the native attitude to

those who merely define that attitude in the way they feel the native ought to feel. My own view is that the inevitable delay which a Commission involves. There was a time when Federation would have been very cheap, and almost no contention. Now there is, so my mind, far too much talk of new capitals, new public buildings, a renewed swarming of official racks, and heads, and a revision on the up-grade of all salaries, and for too little of the increased economy and efficiency that are actually obtainable.

Nevertheless, I think that the Government has done right on their proposal, and the success of the Commission show at least no serious basis, times it would appear that the native is to be directly represented, and that the Indian, not least, the British taxpayer, but the matter. H.E. and Lady Grigg pay a visit.

["The Standard" Special]

The Hon. Lady Grigg extends to the public in Kenya an invitation to visit the African Child Welfare Centre at Pumwani.

On September 1 she paid her second call since her arrival in Nairobi—and on this second occasion took H.E. the Governor with her.

The brightness, simplicity, cheerfulness, enthusiasm and progress they found is described in the following report of the visit.

African women are proving a great success as probation nurses and in domestic service connected with the Home.

During August 274 out-patients attended at the clinic.

It was difficult to say which of the two was the more thoughtful. The two-story building, with its outer walls of white with a lining of red bricks, is a simple and well-planned structure.

Incidentally the Pumwani Clinic is likely to attract to the colony who are interested in the welfare of the African child.

Lady Grigg brought with her several excellent pictures which had got specially from America, and which were suitable for each of the establishments.

By her side on the ground floor were several small tables, and on the wall behind her were several framed pictures.

The Matron led the visitors to the kitchen and showed them the various appliances and the arrangement of the kitchen.

Upstairs there is the playground for the children and the room for the staff.

One of the most important features of these premises is the examination of patients and their progress.

That they may not think light of the services which are available at the clinic is a very important matter.

Figures are often more eloquent than any words, and those for the African child welfare work are no exception.
