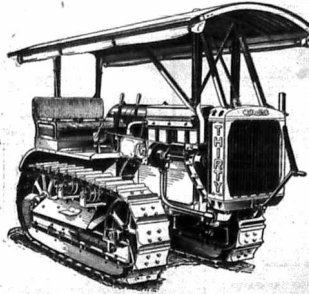

ROAD POLICY OF THE COLONY DEFINED.

Use of Loans for Construction of Feeder Roads.

FIRST INSTALLMENT £100,000.

The desirability that railway and road construction should go hand in hand in the development of the Colony's resources and in the opening up of new areas for production was stressed in the Legislative Council when the raising of a loan for £100,000 for work on roads was sanctioned.

Whilst it was recognised that the roads contemplated would not strictly be of a permanent character, it was felt that the use of loan money for the purpose contemplated was justified since it would lead to the stimulation of production and the more economical and more expeditious marketing of produce.

ROAD BOARD'S SCHEME.

In the Legislative Council on the needs of the country in respect of roads the Hon. the Colonial Secretary (Sir Edward Dutham) moved the following resolution:

"It is resolved and it is hereby resolved that this Council approve of a Loan of £100,000 for the construction of feeder roads in the Colony in 1927 and of the money to be so provided being appropriated as applied to the purposes specified in the schedule hereinafter."

And he further resolved that this Council endorse the approval of the Loan in the schedule of the Public Loans Ordinance of such amount as it may be necessary to sanction the said loan to be repaid."

SCHEDULE.

£100,000. Road. Sir Edward Dutham said: One of the great deficiencies under which this country has laboured during the past few years has been the want of roads in various parts of the country.

"It is proposed to continue to meet that expenditure from loan funds. ## SOME ASPECTS OF THE BUDGET.

No. 6.

## THE COST OF CONTROLLING CRIME AND ADMINISTERING PUNISHMENT.

The following article, the sixth of the series, deals with the expenditure on the Police and Prisons Departments and again affords a comparison with 1926.

It will be seen that there is a very material increase in the cost of the Police Department which is not wholly accounted for by the development of the Railway and Post Police but is chiefly due to heavy revisions of the salaries of European officials.

There has been an increase in the pay of the heads of both departments.

## THE RAILWAY AND POST POLICE.

The Police Department follows naturally in the Kenya Estimates after the Judicial and Legal sections of the Administration. The vote for this Department includes provision for the Railway and the Post Police as well, and the cost thereof is reimbursed by the Railway Department.

The Police vote is given a long explanation in the memorandum which accompanies the Budget. It is explained that it is intended to increase the Railway and Post Police by extra staff—some Superintendent, an Inspector, five Police Sergeants, and six Police Constables. It is also explained that the cost of the Railway and Post Police is to be met by the Railway Department.

In the Kenya Police, that is to say the staff for the work of the Colony, there is a decrease of 478 appointments as for the cost of the present year. Certain new appointments are being listed in 1927, a change is proposed in the clerical department, and savings

sums who will take the place of an Assistant Commissioner during a slightly smaller salary. The list of the new appointments approved by the Legislative Council.

Two Assistant Inspectors are also being provided for the Finger Print Bureau and one for the C.I.D. It is pointed out that the Finger Print Department of the Police requires constant strengthening as its usefulness has only been proved since it was introduced in 1925. The Bureau is working as in the highest pressure and must break down unless the additional assistance is provided.

An additional European constable is also being provided who will take the place of the Inspector of Constabulary and the cost will be recovered from the Treasury.

**Weakness in Clerks.**

The Commissioner has found that the clerical staff of his Department is unable to deal satisfactorily with the increasing clerical duties so competent typists and office workers are being added who will also supervisory general office work. Two European clerks are being added and four non-European will do general office work.

With a view to further economy, a Master Clerk has been added to the Police staff for the making of uniforms. This enables a reduction in the clothing vote of £300—

The Railway Police.

The balance of the addition to the cost of the Police during the current period is accounted for by the increased cost of the Railway and Post Police. In 1926 the Railway contributed for Wages and Post £2,730, but in 1928 Budget the figure for that branch is £10,225.

But on the whole, as the 1926 Report of the Police Department showed, there was need for improvement and the Department now one of the most modern and efficient of the Government.

The Prisons.
