Largest Item in the New Budget.

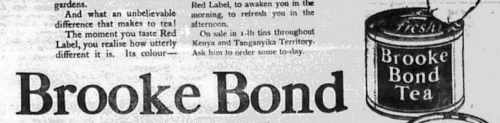

### IMPORTANT TEST CASE ON SQUATTER LAW.

#### Many Convictions of Innocent People.

Judges have been issued in a Criminal Revision case, the Crown through the Labour Inspector against V. Turner, Manager of Limited Estate. The case arose originally before the 2nd class Magistrate at Kitale. 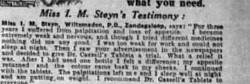

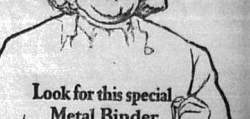

Dispossession Follows the Town Planning Scheme.

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT.]

Mombasa, Dec. 8.—Some interest is being aroused here over the question of the native dispossession of their homes by the demolition of buildings on the new Town Planning scheme. 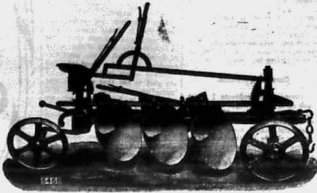

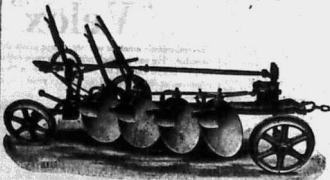

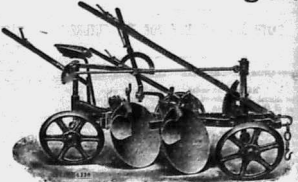

had very great difficulties to contend with. I say we because I have put in the way of identification beyond with the Colony. (Heaven knows) that I can not credit for the rising of the price of wheat since 1922, but we have actually not only made up the deficit of the deficit, but we have also raised our surplus balance up to the neighbourhood of half a million. I believe that our surplus balance will well over half a million when the accounts are closed at the end of this year. (Applause).

Unless complete control of local matters is left to the people, the majority of whom are alien, there is no object to be gained by Kenya joining in the proposed Federation. Cooperation and co-ordination might be attainable, but it has long been apparent that Kenya Colony should have been granted self-government many years ago. "Trust the man on the spot," is the motto of the Duke of Devonshire and when referring to the late Sir Robert Curzon, who was his Governor, that it should be done, and no doubt would be were it not for the selfish autonomy should be granted to Kenya.

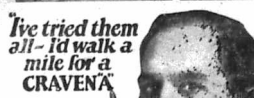

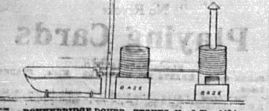
