BRITAIN'S INTEREST IN THE ROYAL VISIT.

Why the Prince is Universally Popular.

That the Home Press is keenly interested in the forthcoming visit of the Prince of Wales and the Duke of Gloucester to East Africa is evident from the many references contained in newspapers mentioned by the last column in the course of a leading article in the *Fortnightly*. But another article this autumn—this time to East Africa and Northern Rhodesia, almost the only parts of the British Empire, which has not been previously visited. He has been before in Africa—the South, which since his visit has come into the limelight of notice as another Riviera, and even in the Transvaal, where he was his way into the very heart of state affairs, grim as Kruger himself, who were prepared to be polite but stiff to the pre-arranged schedule of the "Union Jack." But by his unflinching good fellowship and unconvictionality, his courtesy, and thought for others, he "endured" them all.

In the Roman Empire it was imperial etiquette that the Emperor and those born in the purple did not meet the people. But even in their triumphal rodee, even in their triumphal rodee, through cheering crowds with set faces, unglazed by any sign of human emotion, it was the face of a god that the people must look upon—a god of the old mythology, inscrutable, inflexible, unchangeable. And even through the Middle Ages there was often a reminder in this old affection, by such monuments as Louis the Fourteenth, and in our own days, occasionally by that supreme ornament of the Empire, the Emperor, the Emperor, who claimed in content with the Emperor of Austria the inheritance of the leadership of the Holy Roman Empire and its territories. All that is the very antithesis of the attitude of the Prince of Wales. His appearance to the British Crown.

A Very Human Person.
The Prince was never at such himself as when, in some solemn function of recognition in the land of Rhodesia in 1925, he pulled up a little child who had come from a distance to see him and asked: "Would you like an orange and when she said timidly, she certainly would, carried her off to his carriage to get a "very large orange." He is, in short, a very

human person, not an imperialist god-god—more over ready for a camp, a throne, a tramp, or a cold over rough country, much else with a keen eye for a good horse or high-class cut-throat—short a man. And as a man he has made himself loved the world over—in his own Empire and beyond it. Sir Henry Lush, who has the knack of saying in homely and effective phrases the things that the British think, telegraphed on the Prince's return from one of these tours: "Ladies will now forget come home. They have found another strand in the cable of friendship that binds the world together. That truly sums up the work which the Prince has done since a backward-looking Legislature man say in the Far West elected the presentation of his countrywomen at the British Court, New York and Washington and even Chicago—except, perhaps, the Bill and he probably is private—though, for he will have left the chains of the Prince, and know that he is engaged in the task of leading the world to the 'cable' of peace—doing, in fact, Mr. Kellogg's work with a more subtle touch. That sense of non-moral fellowship in the Empire which makes the African and the Australian and the Canadian and the dweller in the island of the sea think of England as "Home"—is in itself a grander triumph of the world, more potent perhaps, than a hundred treaties.

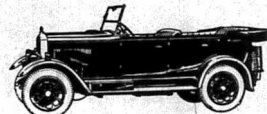
KING'S OWN DOCTOR FOR TWOPOUNCE A WEEK.

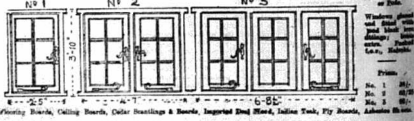

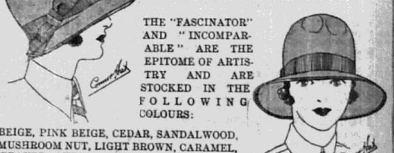

Strayer, Edwards, Acting Chief Veterinary Officer, gave evidence before the Committee of Living Commission recently on the question of meat supply, the importance of which has been emphasized by the fact that the majority of witnesses whose statements have been published have commented on the subject. Major Strayer, Edwards pointed out that there were two sources of meat supplies, namely in the raw state reserved and in settled areas.

The shortage of bullocks in settled areas has been caused by the fact that farmers did not prefer beef animals, but rather bred for dairy purposes. In a drought this class of beasts quickly lose condition.

Bullocks were purchased by weight of the carcass. It followed that with rapid loss of condition the price paid dropped accordingly, and before the farmer kept his animals until grazing was plentiful and they regained condition, and therefore continued to rise. The average live weight of grade beef in the month was 1,100 lbs. further space for the shortage of beef in the month was the price of slaughter cattle during the year was unable to rise.

It was recommended that bullocks should arrange to keep an ample supply on hand and acquire grazing for the purpose. The ruling price at the moment was 15s 6d per lb. dead weight. The average value of grade bullocks was about £7.10 to £8. The high cost of meat was largely due to the high prices paid for slaughter cattle, and to the fact that as soon as animals were required to meet the demand of best cuts in the Tropics.

Poor Quality.

Meat in this country was generally of poor quality, a great deal of which would be condemned at home for "unsatisfactory." In this country practically all condemned

meat was due to infection with trichina, which was very prevalent in certain areas and identified in the scraps of purchases of slaughter stock. The percentage of condemned carcasses during the past 5 years was about 10 per cent. This figure was lower than the percentage for 1925, 5.8 per cent. for 1924, and 5.2 per cent. for 1923.

Meat Reserve Cattle.

In 1927, seven tenths of meat in the N.F.D. is supplied from the Meat Reserve. In the last 4 months approximately 20,000 bullocks had been purchased from this area. These cattle were bought by natives and Somali traders at Ngong where they were sold to the butchers. The Administration was arranging the butchers to be allowed into the Meat Reserve for exchange for bullocks, and it was considered that would increase the supply of slaughter stock. The Meat had expressed their willingness to bring in slaughter stock for an English provided they were satisfied by the Indian Commissioner. It was hoped to arrange a valuable market on these lines.

Northern Frontier Province.

About 600 head of cattle from the Northern Frontier were allowed into Quinine Station in 1927 but they were found infected with pleuro pneumonia, and could not be introduced into the N.F.D. A special Veterinary staff was set on foot to investigate the cause of the disease. It was suggested that the Government was prepared to allow butchers free grazing and to make an estimate plan for slaughtering slaughter bullocks.

Meat Supply.

Major Strayer, Ngong, stated that the extraordinarily high cost of imported meat during the recent shortage, was very largely due to the fact that so many people, such as boarding house keepers, who could not make contracts did not do so. It was estimated that during some of plenty they could buy in the local market slightly cheaper than by contract, but on a balance (because of the high cost of contract with a producer would pay three times the cost).

When it was a case of a regular contract butchers did not mind to be supplied. He has offered his produce to many of the shops and sometimes supplied daily by one or two dealers in Nairobi. His present price, on the case of such contracts was 17 6d per lb. fat free.

An Immigration Problem.

Writing some months ago on the subject of unemployment in Nairobi we drew attention to the fact that the Government should do everything possible to discourage people coming to Kenya in the Misereable hope that something somewhere, sooner or later, would be bound to turn up. It now appears to have been done in the direction than indicated and as a natural consequence the problem has grown. We understand that there are now about one hundred and fifty unemployed Europeans in Nairobi. That is a small proportion of Nairobi's white population and the position there created is one which cannot be ignored. It is intended to save the Colony from the unhappy experience of a poor white population which, though due mainly to entirely different conditions from those obtaining in Kenya has been such a source of embarrassment to the authorities in South Africa. As we pointed out in the previous article conditions in East Africa are not such as to encourage the immigration of those who have no definite prospect of obtaining work. It is not difficult to understand the outlook of people who, finding it impossible to obtain employment in Britain, and having heard of Kenya's prosperity, the excellent climate of the Highlands and of the opportunities of the country, have decided to seek fortune in an apparently promising land. What their chance in coming must be

advised, their arrival in the Colony is too often attended with painful disillusion and continued disappointment tends to have an effect which is far removed from good. The plain fact is that Kenya at present cannot absorb people without capital or without definite plans and that fact should be made perfectly plain by Government. We agree with the Commissioner of Police that one of the best ways of doing this is to amend the immigration regulations which as constituted at present afford no adequate check on the kind of people coming into the country. In a recent lecture Dr. Gordon dealt with the mental aspect of the problem and pointed out that the only conditions imposed by the regulations were those preventing the admission of those entering the country. We think that one of the easiest and one of the surest ways of preventing the unemployment figures from rising would be to insist that all immigrants must have a definite reason for coming to Kenya; that they must be able to show beyond question that they have work to go to; and that they would not be unreasonably to demand pay in advance of a contract signed by the prospective employer. It may be argued that other people, though undesirable immigrants, that is another aspect of the immigration problem, the solution of which is not so apparent; nor is it likely to assume such serious proportions as that of the entry of unemployed.
